



Health Care Partner Khaled Klele Writes for ABA on Shift to Alternative Payments Models

Partner Khaled Klele, a member of Riker Danzig's Health Care Practice, was published in *The Health Lawyer*, a publication of the American Bar Association's Health Law Section, on "The Path to Successful Utilization of Alternative Payment Models." Khaled co-authored the article with Todd Zigrang, MBA, MHA, FACHE, CVA, ASA and Jessica Bailey-Wheaton, Esq., both of Health Capital Consultants in St. Louis, MO. The article reviews recent trends and changes to federal, quasi-federal, and private alternative payment models, including Accountable Care Organizations (ACOs), as the U.S. healthcare system is shifting from traditional fee-for-service (FFS) payment to value-based APMs, and discusses the implications that may be drawn from these developments.
